The Notaries (Gibraltar) Admission Order 2012

We, CHARLES RICHARD GEORGE, One of Her Majesty's Counsel, Master of the Faculties, so far as we lawfully can or may, DO HEREBY ORDER as follows:

- 1. No person shall be admitted as a Notary to practice in Gibraltar unless such person:
- (a) shall have satisfied Us that he or she has during the period of five years immediately prior to such admission been practising, otherwise than solely in the law of England and Wales, as a lawyer duly qualified and admitted to practise in Gibraltar and continues to be in good standing in such profession; and
- (b) shall have successfully completed and passed the two-year notarial practice course and examinations provided on behalf of Our Faculty Office by University College London (or such other provider as We may appoint from time to time)

save that We may in Our discretion admit to practise a person who does not satisfy (a) above in appropriate circumstances.

- 2. Every Notary so admitted shall undertake whilst in practice to keep himself or herself insured by a suitable policy of professional insurance in the minimum sum of £1million or such increased sum as We shall require by Order from time to time and further to abide by such Rules and Regulations as may be made by Us from time to time for the place and jurisdiction in which he or she is admitted to practise.
- 3. The Orders dated 11 December 1989 (in respect of Gibraltar only) and 11 June 2005 are hereby revoked
- 4. This Order shall have immediate effect.
