## Why should I get an e-Apostille?

- There is no postage required - Saving costs and time on the standard service.
- It is secure – Any attempts to tamper with the document would invalidate the document, and bring up a warning that the document had been modified.
- Greater accessibility – Documents are uploaded when creating the application and are available to download immediately upon completion ready for onwards transmission.
- Easily transmittable – The same e-Apostille can be submitted to multiple authorities simultaneously as required.



## What do I need?

- Your document must be digitally signed by a UK notary public or solicitor.
- Their digital signature must be either an Advanced Electronic Signature (AES) or a Qualified Electronic Signature (QES). We do not accept Simple Electronic Signatures.
- We currently cannot accept certain documents for an e-Apostille. This includes birth/death/marriage certificates issued by the GRO, ACRO or DBS certificates, or fingerprint certificates.
- You will need to confirm that the recipient will accept an e-Apostille.



## What do I do now?

- 1) Visit <https://www.gov.uk/get-document-legalised> and follow the instructions and guidance.
- 2) Upload your digitally signed documents and complete payment.
- 3) Wait for notification that your application is complete.
- 4) Log-in to your account and download your legalised document.
- 5) Send the pdf file to the person/authority who requires it.
